Mirative and Contrastive Focus in Bih

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Basic clause constructions

- (1) Kâo dôk ha sang.
 1 stay LOC home
 'I am home.' (ND008/102)
- (2) ŏng dlăng aduân kâo ti sang.
 2 look grandmother 1 LOC house
 'You look at my grandmother at home.'(ND008/176)
- (3) Gö ma-böng katär tle.
 3 PRE-eat corn pound
 'He ate mashed corn.'(PA012/020)

(4) Kâo brei agăr leh kơ ŏng.
1 give drum PFV LOC 2
'I gave the drum to you already.'(ND007/402)

(5) Truh ta djruah, Arrive LOC deer

dlăngdjruahdôkpa-mămanak.watchdeerPROGCAUS-nursechild'At the deer's place, the deer is nursing her child.' (ND008/501)

Mirative moth

DeLancey (1997): mirative-the grammatical marker for "new or unexpected information" (to the speaker)

(6) Mtao năn brei dôk mơh.
village.chief DIST give stay MIR
'The village chief (to my surprise) agreed for them to get married' (PA011/091)

(7)Arăng ba ajihmơhtapaleiarăng3bringallMIRLOCwife3tasangrăngačô.LOChouse3REFL

'He took it all [the whole half of the roast buffalo] to his wife back at his own house.'(ND007/220)

Contrastive focus moth

Lambrecht (1994): add information into a proposition contradicting what is presupposed or assumed

(8)Nei	aê		ñu	ngă	kĭn	ñu	čiăng,

'Now when his grandfather or his uncle made a crossbow for him, he didn't want it. He wanted (to the speaker's surprise) his father to make one for him.'(PA011/052)

wife	2	roll	mat	not.yet	not.yet	beautiful	
ka		siem	ñu	mơh,	siem	arăng	mơh.

('Your wife who rolls a mat is not as beautiful as her.')							

Mð ŏng ti năn lang añuê, ngă abăn, brei abăn, 2 LOC DIST blanket wife spread make blanket give mat, mơh. ăt siem arăng again beautiful 3 FOC ('Your wife who spreads a mat is not as beautiful as her.')

Mð	phŭn	ŏng,	palei	phŭn	ŏng
wife	root	2	wife	root	2

('Your head wife is not as beautiful as her.')

'It is her who is more beautiful than any of your wives.' (ND008/293)

The differences between Mirative and Contrastive Focus

Mirative

- Sentential operator
- Unexpected information
- Can be replaced by an antimirative particle *yoh*.

Contrastive focus

- NP operator
- Unexpected information which is contradicted what's assumed/presupposed
- Can't be replaced by an antimirative particle *yoth*.

(10)Mtaonănbreidôkyơh.village.chief DISTgivestayPTCL'The village chief agreed for them to get married'

(11) *Nei	aê	ñu	ngă	kĭn	ñu	čiăng,
now grandfather		3	make	NEG	3	want
miêt	wa	ñu	ngă	kĭn	ñu	čiăng
